### BIO AND EDUCATION

Marco Mariano attended high school at Liceo Scientifico G. Arimondi (Savigliano, CN) where he got his diploma in 1987. He got a degree (com laude) in Political Science at the University of Turin (1993) and a PhD in American History at the University of Genoa (1998).

Later he has conducted research activity in several universities and research institutions in the US and in Europe, among them Columbia University, New York University, the National Archives in College Park (MA), the Franklin D. ## CURRENT ISSUES OF RESEARCH

### 1. Title: The Monroe doctrine as ideological framework of transatlantic and interamerican relations

Abstract – The research focuses on how the Monroe doctrine (1823) and its several adaptations in later decades played a crucial role in rationalizing the assumptions and overcome the contradictions in the relations between the US, Europe, and Latin America. It is based on primary sources (American and European archives) as well as a number of materials (eg. the printed media) shedding light on the way in which images of “the other” have been produced and circulated within the Atlantic world.

### 2. The consular and diplomatic network of the Kingdom of Sardinia in the Atlantic world

Abstract – The research focuses on the creation and development of the consular and diplomatic network of Piedmont in time span between the Restoration and the unification of Italy, framed within the wider context of the economic, social, and political integration of the Atlantic world in the “long nineteenth century”. It is based mostly on archival sources held at the Archivio di Stato of Torino, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Rome and the National Archives of Washington, DC.
