CURRENT ISSUES OF RESEARCH

1. Contendibility of electoral systems

The debate on electoral systems points mostly towards an (alleged) trade-off between representativeness and governability. It is argued that a more relevant dimension is contendibility. I am elaborating a contendibility index, to be employed to compare electoral systems through simulation.

2. Indignation, punishment and cooperation.

The evolutionary approach to human behavior, as well as the experimental evidence, show that second and third party punishment are essential to the maintaining the cooperation within a society. The psychological mood sustaining the punishment is indignation. It is argued that the indignation should consequently decrease if the technical possibility of punishment decreases. This hypothesis will be tested experimentally.
